
Social Justice Statement of the ACBC for 2022

In 2023 we are also planning to run some training and formation sessions for Sacramental Coordinators both in parishes, as well as in schools, so there will be even more opportunities for training and formation of lay ministers.

PLENARY COUNCIL

News from the Plenary Council Working Group

The Second Assembly of the Plenary Council has now concluded. The Plenary Council website contains information on the outcomes of the Second Assembly which can be accessed from this site 🌐 the Plenary Council website.

What happens now?

So, what happens now? We have moved into the Implementation Phase and the work continues with a plan, over the next five years, to regularly review the "taking action" in parishes, dioceses and organisations the decisions of the Plenary Council journey. The steps in the next few months, through to November, will include the finalising of the Acts of the Plenary Council and the sending of the Decrees to Rome for approval.

In accordance with canon 446 of the Code of Canon Law, decrees are not to be promulgated until they have been reviewed by the Apostolic See.

Next steps

a. the Bishops Commission for the Plenary Council will be responsible for establishing terms of review for the Plenary Council's implementation;



- b. a roundtable body will be responsible for co-ordinating the review;
- c. interim reports will be published in 2023 and 2025; and
- d. the final review report will be published five years after the Second Assembly, in 2027.

Much of the work of implementation will take place at the local level, including at diocesan synods that are expected to take place within the next five years. (Plenary Council Post Edition 49)

The closing comments from the Concluding Statement of the Second Assembly capture the hopes of all who have been involved in the process. "We have seen God at work in these days, comforting and disrupting in order to lead his people into a future of God's making. This has been a time of grace, and for that we give humble thanks. May God who has begun the good work in us bring it to fulfilment (cf. Phil 1:6)." Click here to read the full statement.

workshops, panels, Mass, Adoration, a renewal expo, and opportunities to exchange ideas with others from across Sydney. The conference will provide an opportunity for priests, deacons and lay leaders to pray together, for your parish leaders to receive formation in evangelisation, and share ideas that can assist the practical renewal of our parishes as called for by *Go Make Disciples*. The second of our *Didaskō* - *Online Faith Formation* courses was delivered last month by Rev Dr Greg Morgan, with the addition of the in-person presence of parishioners from St Catherine Laboure in Gymea. Fr Greg presented three sessions on the much-needed topic of *Simple Answers to Spiritual Obstacles: Rekindling our Prayer Life after "Pandemic Procrastination."* The *Didaskō* series will continue throughout 2022 with a new topic each month delivered by some of our finest Catholic theologians, such as **Professors Tracey Rowland** from the 10 August and **Renée Köhler-Ryan** from the 7 September. Finally, the RCIA Certification Course will run for the second time from Tuesday 30 August, from 6:30-8:30pm, and thereafter every other Tuesday for a total of six sessions over twelve weeks. By attending each session of the course, participants will receive a certificate of completion, attesting to the fact that they have received training in the pastoral, catechetical, and liturgical formation aspects of each period of RCIA. Over 60 participants from Sydney parishes attended the first course, with beginners and veterans of RCIA commenting on how invaluable the training has been for their new and existing ministries. Integritas Allied Health – a partnership between CatholicCare and ACU

In Allied Health Week of November 2021, CatholicCare Sydney (CatholicCare) and Australian Catholic University (ACU) signed an agreement to partner in the design and delivery of an interprofessional Allied Health service that would provide placement experiences for students in an innovative model of care. This partnership would also enable the creation of a health service with values consistent with the Catholic mission of both organisations.

CatholicCare and ACU recently celebrated the launch of this service at ACU's Blacktown campus. The service, now known as Integritas Allied Health, is based at CatholicCare's Cabramatta West premises and places an emphasis on holistic and person-centred care. It is committed to supporting clients, upholding their dignity, and respecting their participation in decisions about their care.

ACU has the largest enrolments in Allied Health programs in Australia, therefore the graduates from ACU will have real impact on the future delivery of health care services and this partnership will see CatholicCare making a significant contribution to the practical training of students to benefit client care for years to come.

Our CEO, Alastair McGibbon, addressed attendees at the launch event:

"The NSW Ministry of Health's - Health Professional's

Workforce Plan 2012-2022 -recognises the need to develop a collaborative health system to grow and support a skilled workforce, in part, by including interdisciplinary teamwork as a component of all professional entry curricula and by providing interdisciplinary clinical education to support patient care.

"We are extremely excited to be partnered with the Australian Catholic University on this venture. It provides tangible evidence of the power of collaboration and partnerships between Catholic partners.
