IMPORTANT MATTERS

Note from the Vicar General – Reception of Communion under both Kinds –

Having heard the Council of Priests and taken further advice, the Archbishop has now lifted the prohibition on reception of the Chalice by the faithful. While the prohibition was a temporary measure during Covid, many people will continue to have concerns about infection control and spread of disease more generally, especially during the winter cold and flu season. Parishes choosing to offer Communion from the Chalice should ensure this can be done in an effective and hygienic way, with the Chalice wiped between communicants, and washed between Masses; anyone who might be infectious should refrain from receiving the Chalice. It is important that no one feels pressured to receive from the Chalice; this should a free and well-informed individual decision in the light of the reasonable precautions that parishes can take; and some Masses will lend themselves to this more easily, e.g. smaller weekday Masses.

I would draw your attention to No. 85 in the General Instruction on the Roman Missal: 85. It is most desirable that the faithful, just as the priest himself is bound to do, receive the Lord's Body from hosts consecrated at the same Mass and that, in the instances when it is permitted, they partake of the chalice (cf. no. 283), so that even by means of the signs Communion will stand out more clearly as a participation in the sacrifice actually being celebrated.

A number of priests, and many parishioners, have inquired about resumption of Communion from the Chalice. This is therefore a 'teaching moment' in our communities — which gives us the opportunity to further catechise our people. The key points to explain are:

- Why the Body and Blood of Christ should always be received from a minister, not taken by oneself; hence, there should be no 'self-intinction' from the Chalice, nor taking from the Ciborium.
- 2. Why reception from the Chalice more fully signifies a person's share in the Sacrifice of the Mass.
- Why Christ is fully present under both species of bread and wine, so a person who receives under only one species, is no less graced. Wherever Christ is present, he is wholly present.

4. That the Church recognises two equally valid and respectful ways of the receiving the Body of Christ, on the tongue and in the hand. It may be helpful to remind people of the ancient tradition that we hold our hands, one on top of the other, to "make a throne" for our Eucharistic Lord. In the case of those wishing to receive on the tongue, it might also be helpful to explain how they can do this in a way that is more hygienic for themselves, the priest and others.

Marriage Dispensations Update

Lynelle Lembryk has left the Dispensations role to undertake a new role in a parish. Her last day was Wednesday 26th July 2023. Antonio Esquillon in the Chancery will be assisting with the processing of marriage dispensations until further notice.

<u>Effective immediately</u> please send all Australian Marriage Dispensation requests only to the dispensations email address: <u>dispensations@sydneycatholic.org</u>.

To assist with the transition, we ask that you:

- email the request several months before the wedding
 please do NOT leave the request to the week before the wedding!
- note the date of the wedding and the couples surnames in the subject line. This assists with filtering paperwork and identifying more urgent matters.

Overseas Marriage Paperwork

- For overseas weddings we require the original paperwork. We cannot process overseas marriage paperwork via email.
- At least 3 months notice should be given to allow time to liaise with the couple and obtain any missing documentation. This also allows time for postage as the original documents are sent to the overseas diocese.
- Postage Envelopes: if providing an envelope for postage please do NOT send an International Registered Post envelope. Please use International EXPRESS Post. The registered post does not have tracking and takes a lot longer to arrive at its destination. We have had instances where the paperwork has been lost. International EXPRESS Post provides detailed tracking and generally arrives at its destination within 10 business days.
- If no postage envelope is provided the couple will be asked to collect the paperwork and organise postage. Please note from 1st September the couple will need to collect the paperwork from Leichhardt.

Dispensation/permission Request Numbers

2023 has seen a significant increase in dispensation/permission requests due to the flow on effect of COVID wedding cancelations.



- Australian Dispensation/Permission Requests
 - Jan 2023 current: approx. 350
- Overseas Marriage Paperwork
 - Jan 2023 current: approx. 150

Important to Note: The processing of marriage dispensations/permissions for local and overseas marriages is handled by **1 part-time staff member** hence the importance of sending applications well in advance.

FROM THE LITURGY OFFICE

Baptismal certificates for liturgical ministers

The Liturgy Office has decided to discontinue the practice of asking participants in our courses for a copy of their baptismal certificate. We will now ask that all the necessary checks (baptismal certificates, Working With Children Checks, etc.) be done on the local, parish level. We know that this is already happening in most places and we believe that parishes are indeed the most suitable places to choose and vet their own candidates for liturgical ministries.

This is no small responsibility, given the centrality of the sacrament of baptism for Christian discipleship and ministry, however we are confident that it can rest safely with parishes and their pastors.

This means that from now onwards the Liturgy Office will be asking the participants for **just one document**, that is, the registration form which can be downloaded from our web-page As has been the case so far, the registration form will need to be signed by the pastor as a proof of your endorsement of the person. However, the final sentence on the form has been slightly amended and will now read: "I wish to advise that this parishioner has been selected by me as a suitable candidate for liturgical ministry of ... being a baptised and practicing Catholic of excellent character and a regular worshipper at my parish."

Candidates for instituted ministries (lectors and acolytes) will still need to present us with their baptismal certificates before institutions, should these institutions resume. However, this can be done in the process of preparation for the ceremony.

FROM PARISH SUPPORT TEAM

New Award Rates Applicable to Parish Staff and Increased Superannuation Guarantee Payment – effective 1st July 2023

From the 1st of July 2023, the Federal Government has legislated an increase in the minimum wage, and an increase to the Clerks and Miscellaneous Awards. An increase to the Superannuation Guarantee to 11% also takes effect from this date. For those parishes and communities who make use of the Chancery Payroll Bureau (CPB), these legislated amendments have been seamlessly implemented and no further action is required.



Those individual parishes and communities who have chosen to not make use of the CPB bear the responsibility to ensure their compliance. Any parish or community requiring further assistance should contact **Parish Support** (02) 9390 5233, without delay.

Please note that if at any stage while undertaking their functions, a Fair Work Inspector forms a reasonable belief that an entity has contravened a term of a modern award, there are a range of outcomes that may occur that may lead to an infringement notice being issued (penalties up to \$2,200) or litigation against the entity.

Donations & Bequests

As we move into the season preparing the Parish Financial Report (PFR) all parishes are reminded of the Decree from the Archbishop of Sydney, dated 31 July 2015, that the acceptance or refusal of a bequest to which is attached some qualifying obligation or condition, requires approval by way of an application for an Act of Extraordinary Administration.

As part of the Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney ICT Services teams efforts to provide improved services to Clergy and administrative staff we are moving all email accounts to the Microsoft 365 platform.

The benefits of moving your email to this new platform include improved spam protection, further integration with modern apps, and larger mailbox sizes. It is now time to move all the email accounts held by clergy across to this system. We will be migrating your email across to the new platform on August 17th. On the day of migration there should be minimal impact to you. The process is automatic and does not generally require any input from you, beyond a potential restart of your email client. Mobile users may need to set up the account on their device again, if it does not automatically reconnect.

Office of the Children's Guardian new enforcement powers and penalties

From 1 February 2023, Part 9A of the Children's Guardian Act 2019 came into force, which allows the Children's Guardian to take action to ensure organisations such as the Archdiocese of Sydney comply with the Child Safe Standards. This means where organisations do not comply with the Child Safe Standards, the Children's Guardian can:

- issue a compliance notice to the organisation, or
- accept an enforceable undertaking from the organisation.

If an organisation fails to comply with a compliance notice or enforceable undertaking, the Children's Guardian may commence proceedings to issue penalties.

The Children's Guardian will rely on these enforcement powers, where organisations demonstrate persistent, or deliberate non-compliance with the Child Safe Standards.

The Children's Guardian approach to monitoring organisations is strengths-based and focused on what works best for children, not prescriptive compliance. Monitoring may include reviewing an organisation's systems and processes. They might also inspect an organisation's premises, with permission from the head of the organisation. The Children's Guardian also have the power to direct an organisation to complete a Child Safe Self-Assessment.

The Children's Guardian can also issue a monitoring assessment report to help an organisation improve its compliance with the Child Safe Standards. The organisation must respond to the recommendations made in that report.

2023 Australian Catholic Safeguarding Ltd Audit of the Archdiocese of Sydney

In 2023 Australian Catholic Safeguarding Ltd (ACSL) will be auditing the Archdiocese of Sydney's Parishes, Chaplaincy





Communities and Agencies to ensure compliance with the 10 National Catholic Safeguarding Standards (NCSS). ACSL will conduct site visits to a number of Parishes, Chaplaincy Communities and Agencies as well as conduct informational interviews with key staff in those Parishes, Chaplaincy Communities and Agencies.

The Safeguarding Office has been preparing Parishes, Chaplaincy Communities and Agencies for this audit via the annual Self-Assessment and providing information and handy hints through Safeguarding Training and Newsletters.

Below the Safeguarding Office has put together some handy hints in order to prepare yourself and your community for the upcoming audit:

- Ensuring that all relevant clergy, religious paid staff, including volunteers and students (over 18 years) working directly with children have provided a current WWCC which you have verified through the Office of the Children's Guardian online portal.
- Ensuring that all relevant clergy, religious paid staff, including volunteers and students (over 18 years) working directly with children have read and signed the

- Archdiocese Code of Conduct for Working With Children and records are maintained to support this.
- Ensuring all lay workers, paid staff and volunteers who hold a WWCC have completed the Safeguarding induction training program prior to working with children and records are maintained to support this.
- Ensuring all lay workers, paid staff and volunteers who hold a WWCC have completed the Safeguarding Refresher training program three years after completing the Safeguarding induction training and records are maintained to support this.
- Ensuring Risk Assessments are completed whenever there is an activity or event where children are present such as children's liturgy, youth groups, sacramental programs and retreats.
- Ensuring key contact people within your community are identified and this information is easily accessible to everyone in the community.
- Ensuring the Archdiocese Child Safeguarding Policy is published on your website, in the parish bulletin, and newsletter at least once a year.
- Ensuring items from previous years Self-Assessment Continuous Improvement Plan have been completed or are in the process of being completed.
