

Synod Diocesan Report

The Synod report for the archdiocese was sent to the ACBC and to the Secretariat in Rome. All Deans were sent a copy and asked to send it to the clergy in their deanery. The report was presented at the pre-synodal meeting on May 14 at Mary MacKillop Place. The report is now available on the Archdiocesan website

Framework for Motions (May 2022)

The four-year journey of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia will reach the second – and final – assembly in July 2022.

On June 1, the Framework for Motions document that will be considered at the second assembly was published. It contains 30 motions across eight mission areas that the 277 Members – clergy, religious and laity – will vote on next month.

Thank you for the positive response to *The Catholic Mass* booklet recently launched by Archbishop Anthony in May and available to parishes, schools and movements for order at This guide will be of interest and support to sacramental coordinators, RCIA sponsors and teams, liturgical ministries and anyone seeking to deepen their understanding and reception of the Mass. It can also be used by clergy and parish teams in the lead up to and following the Feast of Corpus Christi, as part of ongoing formation on the Eucharist.

This past month, we were blessed to welcome **Fr Mike Schmitz** as our fourth online guest speaker for the *Reclaiming Evangelisation* series. Fr Mike spoke to a large group of enthusiastic participants at the invitation of the Parish Renewal Team, on the topic 'Why Make Disciples? What our Tradition Tells us About Calling and Forming Disciples.' We were encouraged by the number of parish and community groups who gathered in-person to participate in the online event, and to spend time afterwards discussing how they might apply Fr Mike's insights into their own pastoral reality. The video will be placed online at **www.gomakedisciples.org.au** in due course.

The World Meeting of Families held in Rome will also be celebrated locally in the Archdiocese from Friday 24 to Sunday 26 June. Celebrating the sanctity, beauty and vitality of family life, the celebration begins in parishes with the Feast of the Sacred Heart on Friday and related resources and prayers; followed by family pilgrimages to sites and shrines throughout the Archdiocese on Saturday; and culminating with the Eucharist and a special blessing for families with the Archbishop at St Mary's Cathedral on Sunday with 10:30am Mass, after which families can participate in an inaugural 'Festival of Families' beside the Cathedral with free food, coffee, music, stalls and activities for children. Agency News For July 2022

Living Well Dying Well Community Forum

Held on 25 May 2022 at the Seminary of the Good Shepherd, Homebush and during National Palliative Care Week, the Living Well Dying Well Community Forum has already started much-needed conversations about death and dying in our community. Guests who joined the event either in person or via livestream, were able to hear from an esteemed group of panellists and also had the opportunity to reflect on and share their own personal experiences with the group.

Drawing on a wealth of knowledge and expertise, panellists discussed many aspects of Living Well Dying Well including:

- medical and clinical aspects of palliative care from institutional to community
- current policy and advocacy work being undertaken to support those who have a life-limiting illness and their loved-ones
- discussions regarding the academic, philosophical and ethical elements of end-of-life support in the community

Speaking passionately about these topics, the guest speakers; Patricia Thomas - Grief Care, Megan Best - Associate Professor of Bioethics (who joined remotely) and Maria Cigolini - Senior Palliative Medicine Physician and Associate Professor Medicine encouraged us all to play our role as a community in supporting those with a serious and life-limiting illness, and discussed the importance of normalising healthy conversations about death and dying.

NDIS Support Coordination – central to a successful care plan

Quyen, pronounced Queen, one of CatholicCare's valued NDIS Support Coordinators, applies her knowledge and skills to assist 19-year-old Stanley, who was diagnosed with Down Syndrome when he was born. The nature of this diagnosis creates challenges in many areas of his life, such as relationship building, education, inclusion, employment, and future planning.

Stanley's carer is his mum, whose first language is Cantonese. It was vital for her to connect with a service provider with whom she could easily communicate and build a rapport. Quyen was able to fill this need, being fluent in Cantonese herself.



Quyen knows that the support she provides is crucial to the success of Stanley's life, along with the services he depends on such as Speech and Occupational Therapy for independence in functions such as eating, swallowing, and communicating with his friends and loved ones.

More than a planner, a Support Coordinator makes sure that all service agreements between the family and providers they engage with are fair and in line with NDIS standards and policies. Retaining an experienced and caring Support Coordinator also ensures that a participant such as Stanley has an advocate through complex plan reviews and when requesting an extension of his funds. A Support Coordinator is also able to give assistance to family members with behavioral strategies and resolving issues relating to care and safety.

For Stanley and his family, having Quyen as part of their support team means there is another person to lighten the load and depend on, making his world and theirs, the best it can be.

Quyen says of her support role, "I love what I do for Stanley, I can see that he is more confident in making decisions, and I love to see Stanley achieving the goals that we have set as a team and to witness his inclusion out in the community."

CatholicCare also offer Life Skills and Work Training through Centacare, based at Belmore and now in its 31st year of operation.

Participants can access Centacare programs through their NDIS plan and take advantage of both the learning and social aspects of the centre through cooking and dance classes, day trips, breakfast and coffee clubs, including how to run your own café, and they will soon also have access to certified training courses. In addition, there may be the option to join CatholicCare's team of Supported Employees who provide gardening and cleaning services

across Sydney and there is even a special program for School Leavers to help them become work ready.

Supporting and empowering young mums

Last month we celebrated all mothers on Mother's Day. This month I'd like to take some time for us all to reflect specifically on the role of young mums, particularly those who are struggling with circumstances in their lives that are often out of their control.

Mothering is one of the most underrated, undervalued and challenging life choices for a young woman and is made even more difficult through complex circumstantial barriers.

Young women face stigma, judgement, isolation and are at an increased risk of becoming victims/survivors of Domestic and Family Violence.

As the Practice Manager of CatholicCare's HOPE Program, which assists young women 16-24 years who are pregnant or who have a child under the age of two, I see a myriad of complex challenges that make mothering even more difficult, such as Domestic and Family Violence, child protection issues, homelessness, substance use and Complex Developmental Trauma.

Within the HOPE program, we believe that young women have inherently good aspirations for themselves and their children and it is our role to support them to unlock their own strengths and capabilities and empower them by providing opportunities to be heard and have choices.

HOPE values and amplifies the voices of young mothers by aligning their lived experience with the needs of vulnerable young babies and encourages young women to balance these two needs when making parental decisions.

Young women are empowered to provide safe, nurturing and predictable environments where they can heal from their own lived experiences and build better futures for the next generation. Through ongoing therapeutic complex case management for up to 12 months, the program focuses on early intervention as HOPE can commence working with young women from 20 week's gestation.



Over the past 12 months, we have seen an increased rate of referrals and the complex risk and safety concerns faced by young women and their children have also increased.

We are seeing young women and their children in volatile, unsafe and unacceptable environments because of the violent and abusive behaviours of their partners. We are seeing young women being forced back into unhealthy home environments because their options for safe and affordable accommodation are few and far between and we are seeing young women being disempowered by structures and systems that don't value their lived experiences, and choices that don't provide opportunities to foster growth as young women and mothers.

At HOPE, we are extremely motivated to empower young women to have safe choices and build upon their own strengths and capacity, so they can provide more for themselves and their children.

How we work

The HOPE team are a group of delightful, highly skilled practitioners that are motivated to support the safety and empowerment of young women and their children. They work with young women by providing insights into attachment and attunement with babies and by providing information about the physical and neurological development of young children.

The work of Dr Bruce Perry, Dan Siegel, Bessel van Der Kolk, Stephen Porges and Patricia Crittenden is pivotal for informing much of what we do when working with young women and their babies and ensuring a trauma-informed approach.

The young women in HOPE weren't necessarily afforded predictability or nurturing, warm home environments, so often we focus on unlearning and relearning for the mums so that they can provide this for their children.

HOPE is fortunate to have a small selection of transitional properties which offers a much-needed opportunity for young women to establish their own safe space in the world to begin developing healthy routines, providing an excellent foundation for building positive futures.



I want to acknowledge all the young mums that are trying their absolute best to keep it all together and taking each day one step at a time. We celebrate the young mums who often don't get celebrated, and we want to say that we hear you, we see you, and we think you are absolutely wonderful! We want to congratulate all the young mums who take moments for themselves amongst the chaos of everyday parenting. The mums who put on a load of washing so they can have clean clothes, the mums who make food so they can nurture their bodies and babies and the mums who so graciously welcome us into their homes and show vulnerability, openness and a yearning for more. We are consistently in awe of your resilience, strength and patience. We thank you for all that you are, and everything that you do.
