Other Formation Opportunities during 2023

Afternoon Retreat – 17 February

The Afternoon Retreat held at Hunters Hill Parish was attended by some 26 clergy members. The afternoon was started with a spiritual reflection led by Fr Edmond Travers MSC, followed by exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the Montbel Chapal and finishing with a great meal and fraternity in the evening.

Clergy Conference – 16 March, Le Montage

The afternoon, was commenced with Karen Larkman, Director of Safeguarding and Ministerial Integrity reminding clergy of their obligations with safeguarding followed by Fr Gerry Gleeson, the Vicar General talking on how safeguarding complaints are handled.

The afternoon concluded with Archbishop Anthony Fisher summarising the day.

The event was well attended with 220 people present, including 190 clergy.

FROM PONTIFICIUM **INSTITUTUM ALTIORIS LATINITATIS - LINGUA ECCLESIAE, ROME**

Your Excellency,

the Pontificium Institutum Altioris Latinitatis wish to inform you about the third edition of the intensive course of Latin as a spoken language Lingua Ecclesiae. The course is organized by us along with the Italian Institute for Classical Studies. The course will be held in Rome in September 2023 and it addresses exclusively to ecclesiastics who will spend the entire length of the course, i.e. one month, living together, guested by an ecclesiastic accommodation, carefully chosen. Beside the studying, the guests could dedicate themselves to several moments of pray that take place during the day.

In the past editions, we hosted almost 200 students who, coming from different dioceses of the Church, are now refining their juridical, philosophical and theological studies, or teaching Latin in their dioceses.

In the morning we hold lessons of Lingua Latina; in the afternoon the time is dedicated to personal study and optional courses of Latinitas Patristica, Latinitas Canonica and Latinitas Liturgica. Starting from this edition, we are introducing an additional support for the students:

in the afternoon it will be possible to attend further lessons devoted to deepen and repeat what has been taught in the morning.

Please note that, in case one is not able to come to Rome, a distinct LINGUA LATINA course will be available via zoom.

For the whole month and in every moment of the day the only communication language will be Latin (in the lessons as in the daily life). Since day one, the teachers of the Italian Institute for Classical Studies with a deliberated methodology, acquired through years of using the most efficient didactical methodology, will hold the lessons in Latin and guide the students to the acquisition of an active and passive usage of the language.

At the end of the study program, the students, even though the ones who didn't have any previous knowledge

of the Latin language will be able to read and understand comfortably Latin texts that constitute the precious treasure of the spiritual and cultural tradition of the Church. Besides, having passed the exams, the students will acquire a maximum of 25 ECTS, guaranteed by the Pontificium Institutum Altioris Latinitatis of the Università Pontificia Salesiana.

We hope that your kind courtesy will help us in sharing the information with those who might be interested.

IMPORTANT MATTERS

CCI Insurance for Parishes

Please note that CCI will not insure parishes for Cyber Insurance. This is due to CCI having no way of validating whether parishes have ICT processes in place that reduce



the risk of cyber-attacks. Given the sensitive nature of the financial and personal information that is held on our parish ICT systems, this represents a significant financial and reputational risk to parishes and hence the Archdiocese.

In view of this reality, the Archdiocesan ICT team will be commencing a review of parish ICT systems in the coming months, with the aim of significantly improving the relevant technology and reducing parish vulnerability to cyber-attack. As a result, certain parishes may incur an initial cost to implement the necessary upgrades. This cost, however, is negligible as compared with the potential loss that might result from a data breach or other hacking event.

Moreover, if the Archdiocese is able to validate each reviewed parish once the upgrades have been completed, then CCI may extend insurance cover to include those parishes.

If such a request is made to a PP and he supports the request, he should consult further with the Chancery before a final decision is made."

The Sydney Centre for Evangelisation has partnered with the Theology of the Body Institute to bring their online



ARE YOU OVER 65? All clergy over 65 are encouraged to apply for the Commonwealth Seniors Health Card. Sign up via the Services Australia website, which leads you step-by-step through the process. (If you have recently applied for the Disaster Recovery Payment – this will be an easier procedure – as most of the work will have been done.) NB: It is important to note that Exempt Fringe Benefits (eg S57 FBTAA exemption for benefits provided by a religious institution to its religious practitioners) are not Reportable Fringe Benefits and, therefore, not treated as Adjusted Taxable Income for the purposes of assessing eligibility for the Seniors Health Care Card.

YOUR CLERICAL FUND CLAIMS: To assist with administration, the Committee appreciate claims being made on an annual basis. Please remember that claims can only be submitted for medical expenses up to 2 years prior.

The Ephpheta chaplaincy has been a rewarding ministry these past eight years. Getting to know the Deaf community has benefitted me personally. I've also learnt something of Deaf culture and will try to share some pastoral ministry tips I have learnt.

I tend to be focused in my thinking and attention. Learning sign language demanded attention to detail.

needed to learn to see the subtle changes in body language and, especially, the rapid movements of the fingers. I had found reducing the complexities of the faith to simple, orderly explanations quite difficult, e.g. to preach with language the whole congregation could understand. Again, Deaf ministry required this simplification, and encouraged

guage the whole congregation could understand. Again, Deaf ministry required this simplification, and encouraged a very straightforward ordering of communications. An explanation that flowed visually and naturally was preferred, like a long movie scene taken in one shot.

Auslan (Australian Sign Language) has its own grammar. Sometimes the ordering of concepts reminds me of the Greek and Latin learnt in seminary, e.g. the verb is often placed at the end. This makes simultaneously signing and speaking prayers quite difficult and a bit stilted, but not impossible.

I have found myself inspired by the patience of Deaf people. They have exemplified strong and resilient faith, and selfless generosity in works of mercy.

Serving Deaf and hard of hearing people pastorally be-



gins with engaging with the individual. Circumstances differ dramatically from person to person. Some Deaf read lips, some can speak, some don't sign at all, and some have other challenges or disabilities. Hard of hearing people might have a Cochlear implant or be disinclined to use sign language.

You should try to communicate squarely face-to-face. This way, your enunciation, facial expressions, and body language are clearly visible. Presuming you don't know sign language, a written message in simple English, with short words and sentences is usually a good start. I say 'usually', because there is no guarantee that a Deaf person has learnt English reading and writing. Perhaps, without phonetics, they struggled to learn English?

Take the cue from the person in front of you. He or she may have a preferred interpreter. For many

Deaf, booking an interpreter is normal for important occasions. However, know that interpreters are expensive and government support only goes so far. Always look at the Deaf person who is communicating with you, not the interpreter!

Qualified interpreters have a good sense of the best places to stand, suitable lighting, and the relative difficulty of translating a prepared text. They may be able to recommend simpler words. A printed copy of a presentation is often useful, especially if it is written in simple English and provided in advance. Note that a Deaf person will need time to read a provided text, so you should provide a pause

for reading. Keep it short. Reading sign language or text in a second language is taxing.

Generally, strong, diffuse lighting with a simple background is best for reading sign language. Be sure to provide Deaf with a well-lit place at the front of processions and liturgical events to allow them line of sight. Culturally, it is common for Deaf in the front pews to sit, even when the congregation is standing, so that the line of sight for Deaf behind them is preserved.

Sacramental preparations require a little extra work. Retreats and courses may be navigable with an interpreter, but generally it is better to have a simplified course prepared and for the priest to engage directly with the help of an interpreter. The Deaf person/s should be asked their preference. Access to communal events helps foster involvement in the life of the parish and is much appreciated.

Often, Deaf have a poor experience of the Sacraments. E.g. Mass can be terribly boring when you understand almost nothing of what is happening. A Powerpoint or printed homily can help for Mass and other events. Priestly garb, and a name tag or card can smooth introductions.

Of course, if in doubt or needing assistance, the chaplaincy, which covers Sydney, Parramatta, and Wollongong is eager to help.



Sydney Catholic Early Childhood Services (SCECS) is proud to announce the opening of two new centres in the parishes of Caringbah and Coogee, strengthening and adding value to the existing Catholic network of Early Childhood Education and Care Services. The purpose built Caringbah centre provides education and care for 76 children whilst the Coogee centre is a newly renovated existing building located on-site of St Brigid's Parish providing care for 98 children. Both centres opened in January/ February this year and have been well received in the community.

The Coogee centre occupies the site of the original primary school and sits beside the church. It is a large centre which has an additional external building for preschoolers. I would like to thank you all for your ongoing support of the Safeguarding Office and the commitment you have shown over the past 7 years in completing mandatory safeguarding training requirements to meet our responsibilities under the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards (NCSS) and the Office of the Children's Guardian NSW, Child Safe Standards.

In 2023, rather than inviting you to attend a safeguarding training session at the Polding Centre as we have in previous years, we have planned an interesting and informative Safeguarding Conference at Waterview, Bicentennial Park, Sydney Olympic Park on 1 June 2023. The Conference will run from 10.30 – 3pm with registrations commencing at 10am and will include a delicious lunch and opportunity to meet and speak with your fellow clergy during lunch and break times.

Our decision to hold a Safeguarding Conference rather than providing a new 2023 training session is in response to changing compliance requirements within the Safeguarding space in terms of our accountability to statutory bodies and Australian Catholic Safeguarding Ltd (ACSL). The Archdiocese as a whole, including parishes, chaplain-



cies and agencies will be audited by ACSL this year, ACSL will produce a public report on the Archdiocese compliance with the National Catholic Safeguarding Standards (NCSS). Some parishes and chaplaincies are across this; however, others still have some way to go.
