ONGOING FORMATION OF CLERGY

Just a reminder that on Friday, **25 November 2022**, the Archbishop will host the annual Pre-Advent Clergy Gathering in St Mary's Cathedral Precinct. The event will commence at 2.30pm with registrations and refreshments in the Cathedral Hall.

The Program will begin with the Archbishop's review of the year, followed by a Q & A session. We then will move to the Crypt for a Penitential Liturgy, during which the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be offered. The Liturgy will finish with Benediction.

During the month of October over 35 clergy attended the first of two training sessions with Worklogic.

The training was on Conversations that Matter. Expressions of interest for courses in Liturgy in 2023

In 2022 the Liturgy Office has offered a record number of courses for lay liturgical ministers: Readers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Acolytes / Senior Altar Servers. We offered 13 courses for parishes and 3 courses for Sydney Catholic Schools. Much to our joy, the feedback about these courses, both unofficial (participants talking to us during breaks and after the sessions) and official (anonymous feedback sheets distributed at all workshops) has been overwhelmingly positive. We are planning to continue to offer these training/formation sessions in 2023, and also to launch some new courses, among them workshops for Sacristans and Church Musicians. In addition to this, in 2023 we are hoping to start a series of talks on the general meaning of liturgy and sacraments in the Catholic tradition. One of the things that we have learned this year is that there is great hunger out there for learning more about the sacred liturgy, so we would like to respond to this need as best as we can. We will keep you posted about all this in due course. Information about our courses will also be available on our web-page, which is currently being produced and which hopefully will be launched in the next few weeks.

At the moment, we are accepting expressions of interest from parishes for courses in 2023. If you would like us to come to your parish to offer training and formation, please get in touch with us with the following information:

- What kind of course you would like us to do, and when?
- How many parishioners are you planning to send to this course?
- Do you have a venue to hold the course? We need a hall, and also access to the church. We do not need the church every week, but we do need it at least once during each course – we will give you more details when you contact us. We have our own computers, projector and sound system, so we can work even in quite a basic parish/school hall.

Following the feedback that we received, we have decided to make some of our courses a bit longer – it turns out that people want to learn more! Therefore, current length of the courses is:

- Readers: 2 sessions, 3 hours each
- Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion: 3 sessions, 3 hours each
- Senior Altar Servers / Acolytes: 3 sessions, 3 hours each

We are yet to make a decision about the length of the other courses. Again, we will keep you posted.

Our courses are normally held on Saturday mornings 9am-12noon, however we have also run sessions on weekday evenings 6pm-9pm, so we can be flexible.

In order to give the participants a high-quality, meaningful educational experience, we need to cap the number of participants at a reasonable level. Therefore, the suggested maximum number of participants at these courses is:

Readers: 30 peopleEMHCs: 45 peopleAcolytes: 30 people

These numbers are not set in stone and are given here as a general guideline. We have never turned anyone away on the day of the course, and we hope that we will never have to do that. However, please remember and remind your parishioners that registrations are essential, they are a necessary part of our preparation for these sessions.

RCIA Certification Course

CLERGY REMUNERATION SYSTEM AND CLERICAL **FUND INVITATION**

Thank you to those who attended the Annual General Meetings of both the Clergy Remuneration System and Clerical Fund on 26 October.

All clergy should have now received the Reports and Presentations via email. If you have not received same, please contact the office on 9390 5166.

As discussed at the AGM, to ensure the viability of the fund, we need to return to pre-Covid income levels. This is even more urgent due to the effect of inflation on household expenditure. The following points were mentioned at the AGM – and we now include them here for all Parish Priests. Administrators and Assistants, for immediate action:

- Ensure collections are taken up (don't just leave a basket at the door etc)
- Recurring credit card/direct payments givers are encouraged to give to the first collection (as well as the second)
- Tap facilities should be set up with a split for first and second collections (split should reflect the loose collections being received)
- Baptism and Christmas Offering envelopes be widely distributed
- That donations for weddings are processed as per the rules of the System.

SAFEGUARDING

Recording and Reporting Safeguarding Complaints and Concerns

The Archdiocese of Sydney encourages the reporting of Safeguarding Concerns and/or Complaints by an individual who reasonably and in good faith suspect's unacceptable practice or behaviour by a person associated with the Archdiocese of Sydney through employment, contract or volunteering.

Just a reminder that the Safeguarding Office has developed a suite of documents to help Clergy with Safeguarding Complaints and/or Concerns that come to their attention such as;

- Flowchart: Reporting Safeguarding Complaints: This Flowchart assist Clergy in how and where to make report when they suspect that a person has acted in a manner that is inappropriate or unsafe towards a Child.
- Form: Reporting Details of Safeguarding Complaint:
 This form is to be filled out by Clergy, Agency Head, or any person who suspects a Reportable Crime, Reportable Allegation, conviction considered to be a Reportable Conviction, or otherwise has a Safeguarding Concern.
- Flowchart: Managing Safeguarding Complaints:
 This flowchart sets out the steps for managing a Safeguarding Complaint after it has been notified to the Safeguarding Office.

Visiting Clergy Protocols updated

All clergy engaged in public ministry require habitual Faculties granted by the Bishop of the place in which they reside and/or exercise their appointed ministry. Whenever clergy move to minister in another diocese or parish, they require Permission to Minister in that new situation from the appropriate authority. Such permission can only be granted when a cleric's Bishop or Ordinary has testified to his good standing and his Working With Children Check (WWCC) has been verified by the receiving diocese or parish. There are various procedures for obtaining permission to minister in another diocese depending on where a cleric is incardinated and on which documentation is available.

The Visiting Clergy Protocols have recently been amended to remove references to the former Towards Healing Declarations 45.6 and 45.7. Significant changes have been made regarding when a cleric without a Ministry card, without Sydney faculties, but with an ACMR ID number, visits to minister in a Sydney parish and when a cleric without a Ministry card, without Sydney faculties, and without ACMR ID number, visits to minister in a Sydney parish.



Protocols for Faculties, Ministry Cards, Safeguarding Statements and ACMR ID Numbers

Introduction

All clergy engaged in public ministry require habitual Faculties granted by the Bishop of the place in which they reside and/or exercise their appointed ministry. Whenever clergy move to minister in another diocese or parish, they require Permission to Minister in that new situation from the appropriate authority. Such permission can only be granted when a cleric's Bishop or Ordinary has testified to his good standing and his Working With Children Check (WWCC) has been verified by the receiving diocese or parish.

There are various procedures for obtaining permission to minister in another diocese depending on where a cleric is incardinated and on which documentation is available.

There are three methods of identification for clergy:

- A Greater Sydney Ministry Card: By a mutual agreement, the Archdiocese of Sydney and the Dioceses of Broken Bay, Parramatta and Wollongong have authorised the use of Ministry Cards for clergy from these dioceses, which testify to both the cleric's good standing and record his verified WWCC.
- 2. An ACMR (Australian Catholic Ministry Register) ID Number: The ACMR ID Number is a national scheme oversighted by Australian Catholic Safeguarding Ltd (ACSL) that acknowledges the good standing of a member of the Clergy. Once registered and given an ACMR ID Number, Clergy are able to use this ID Number in any diocese throughout Australia to confirm their good standing. The AMCR ID Number needs to be verified by the Diocese or parish with ACMR. However, verification of a cleric's ID Number does not verify his WWCC clearance.

The former Towards Healing Declarations 45.6 and 45.7. have been replaced with Safeguarding Statement or Individual Safeguarding Declaration and Disclosure Forms.

The Safeguarding Statement form allows visiting Clergy who have not been subject to a substantiated complaint or are not subject to any ongoing safeguarding complaints or allegations to receive clearance to minister by confirming they are of good standing and by having the document signed by the relevant Church Authority.

Clergy and Religious who are subject to substantiated and/or ongoing safeguarding allegations must disclose this information on the Individual Safeguarding Declaration and Disclosure form. However, confirmation of a cleric's good standing does not verify his WWCC clearance.
