



A Short Message From Archbishop Anthony Fisher OP

*Dear Fellow Priests and Deacons
My fraternal greetings to you all!*

Last month I announced that the Marist Fathers would be relinquishing their entrustment of St Patrick's Parish Church Hill on the 31st of December 2025. In recent years, we have celebrated the wonderful work of the Marist Fathers and will again celebrate this work before the end of 2025. Here I record my own thanks, and that of the Archdiocese, for over 154 years of their faithful service to the parishioners and visitors to the beautiful shrine of St Patrick at the Rocks.

The recent announcement was understandably met both by sincere sadness and immense gratitude. As the Marists built on the work of Archdeacon McEnroe and the colonial Church, so now a new generation must build upon the foundations laid, and faithful service rendered by, the Marist Fathers since then.

During the forty months until the handover, we have time to discern the path forward for maintaining what is already best at St Patrick's, including the generous provision of Masses, Confessions and Eucharistic Adoration, as well as creating new opportunities for inner-city ministry. Here we might think of new ways to reach and serve city office workers, homeless people, tertiary students, young professionals and families, those interested in adult faith formation, tourists, the elderly, lonely or isolated, and those in need of a spiritual home.

There will be forums held at the parish level to assist with the process.

ONGOING FORMATION OF CLERGY

CAS Annual Retreat 2022

The Sydney Diocesan Retreat this year was held at St. Joseph's Spirituality Centre, Baulkham Hills. The retreat director was Fr. Aloysius Rego OCD. There were 21 priests and deacons from the Archdiocese including two religious. The centre at Baulkham Hills provides a comfortable and spacious setting for the retreat.

The retreat centred around the life and spirituality of St. Therese of Lisieux. I think most of us were familiar with Therese's 'Little Way' but there is so much more to Therese's life in the Convent of Carmel.

Therese emerged from a very devout Catholic family in France at the end of the 19th Century. Her determination to enter Carmel at 15 years of age led to a trip to Rome to

obtain permission from Pope Leo XXIII. After this permission was granted, she began her life at Carmel.

It became clear for Therese that true 'perfection' was giving ALL to God and that her spirituality was totally focused on Jesus. Fr. Aloysius spoke about how Therese always consulted the Scriptures to see what they had to say before entering into her 'little way.' For Therese the 'little way' was reducing the distance between God and her, and although not the way for everyone, Therese felt the need to share it so that others might benefit from its path to Jesus.

Of course, Therese had a particular devotion in praying for priests and this is still very much the work of the Carmelite sisters.

There has been much discussion in recent times about the style and nature of the diocesan retreat and I welcome any feedback for next year's retreat.

SYDNEY CATHOLIC SCHOOLS BACK TO PARISH INITIATIVE

In recent months Sydney Catholic Schools has been 'rolling out' a 'Back to Parish' initiative. This initiative aims to strengthen the relationship between our school and parish communities by increasing the regular Mass attendance of students and parents.

Through this, it is also hoped to strengthen our sense of community and people's participation in and contribution to our Catholic faith community.

Traditionally, Catholic primary schools have supported their local parish by encouraging parent attendance at Sunday Mass.

Normally, this has been achieved through the planning and conduct of 'family Masses'. In many instances however these have been 'ad hoc', and have had no real impact on people's regular attendance. The back to parish initiative aims to address this.

Primary schools are being asked to work with their local parishes so as to develop a more systematic approach. In addition to the year groups involved in 'sacramental preparation', it is hoped that each class group will have specific occasions throughout the year when all families attend Mass together. This will look very different from community to community and will be determined by local circumstances.

While Sydney Catholic Schools actively promotes family Masses for particular Year Groups, it encourages all families to attend Mass each and every Sunday.

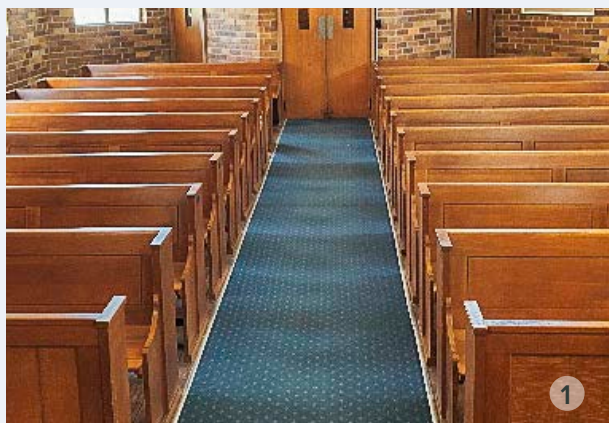

CatholicCare Sydney was excited to welcome the Minister for Families and Communities, the Honourable Natasha Maclaren-Jones MLC, on 22 August to hear about the early intervention program HOPE, and to meet with some of the HOPE mothers and their babies.

After chatting with our CEO, Alastair McGibbon, about the positive outcomes of the program, the Minister was able to hear first-hand from the mothers about the significant difference HOPE has made in their lives.

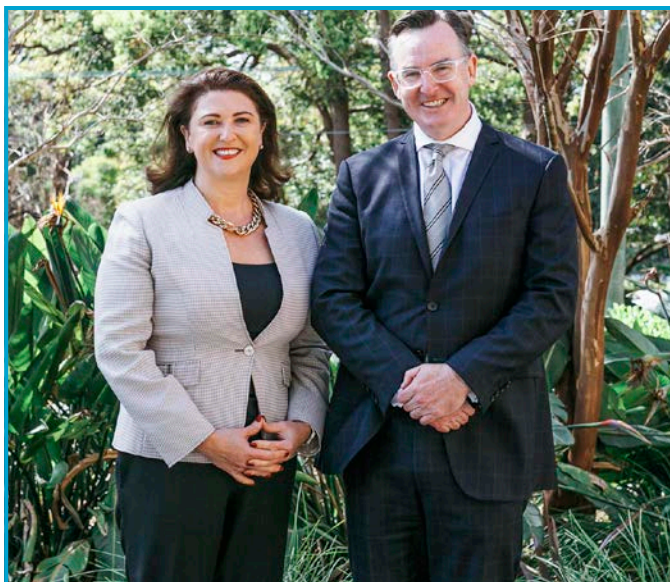
HOPE young women are aged 16-24 and are soon-to-be mothers, or already have an infant under the age of two. They are struggling with and experiencing concerns which may include: mental ill-health; intellectual disability; current domestic or family violence; being a victim-survivor of sexual abuse; living in unsafe housing, being homeless or at risk of homelessness; living with the impact of their own difficult childhood experiences; and alcohol and substance abuse concerns that has led to past involvement with the criminal justice system.

The HOPE program focuses on building parental capacity to establish and strengthen parent-infant relationships, through a therapeutic approach that is person-centred. By participating in HOPE, young mums receive the tools, training and resources to best support their children, along with assisting them to achieve their academic and vocational goals.

CatholicCare Sydney is looking to expand the program to increase the number of Sydney mums we can help annually

from 30 to 125 over the next few years. However, without the help of either the government or generous members of the community, this additional support for this very vulnerable group may not be possible.

Child Protection Week 2022

On Sunday 11 September the Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney celebrated National Child Protection Week for the sixth year in a row. This year's theme was Celebrating Differences. Child Protection Week provides us with an opportunity to reflect on how we celebrate and embrace differences within our community. To help us reflect, the Safeguarding Office has developed a new resource for Children; the *Celebrating Differences – We are all special- Activity Book*. This resource can be accessed on the Safeguarding website: 

The Safeguarding Office encourages you all to take the time to reflect on how we can all participate in the shared responsibility of caring for and protecting our Children and Young People as well as how we can all celebrate differences within our community and life.

Child-Related Activity Register's

The Child Related Activity Register (Register) is an electronic tool to record details of the Working with Children Check and Safeguarding Induction and training details of volunteers and paid workers who are engaged in a Child-Related roles such as Readers, Collectors, Youth Ministers, Acolytes and Eucharistic ministers. The Register assists the Parish Priest/Administrator to fulfil his legislative requirements applicable to both the *Children's Guardian Act 2019* and the *Child Protection (Working with Children) Act 2012*.

Child-Related Activity Registers for the period of January - June 2022 were due back to the Chancery Office for auditing in July 2022.
