ONGOING FORMATION OF CLERGY

LIVE IN CLERGY CONFERENCE

8–11 April Novotel Wollongong

It is time to register for the 2024 Live-in Clergy Conference. It will be held from Monday, 8 April to Thursday, 11 April at Novotel Wollongong Northbeach, 2/14 Cliff Rd, North Wollongong NSW 2500.

This will be the first extended Clergy gathering since Leura 2018. While we are moving from the mountains to the sea, Wollongong 2024 will follow a similar format, given the positive evaluations of Leura 2018, particularly the balance between seminars, workshops, worship, prayer and relaxation.

The Conference theme is Synodality serving renewal: Enabling the Holy Spirit to inspire and guide our missionary response to contemporary challenges.

On the 50th anniversary of the Institution of the Synod of Bishops (17.10.2015), Pope Francis asserted that "it is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium."

The Instrumentum Laboris (a.59) for the First Session of the XVI Ordinary General Synod on Synodality (October 2023) stated that "the more one is called to serve the Church, the more one must feel the urgency of formation: Bishops, Priests, Deacons, Consecrated men and women and all those who exercise a ministry need formation to renew the ways of exercising authority and decision-making processes in a synodal key and to learn how to accompany community discernment and conversation in the Spirit." The three pillars of Synodality identified by Pope Francis in his homily during Mass for the Opening of the Synodal Path (10.10.2021) – encounter, listening and discerning – underpin the Archdiocesan Mission Plan, Go Make Disciples.

Wollongong 2024 provides an opportunity for we clergy of the Archdiocese to be formed in, reflect on, converse about and formulate ways to lead our communities along the "path of synodality". The Conference falls at the midpoint between the First and Second (October 2024) Sessions of General Synod. Implementation of the Synod's outcomes will begin in 2025.

Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB, President of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference and 5th Plenary Council of Australia and a President-delegate appointed by the Pope for the Synod's First Session will present two keynote addresses. Workshops will explore the theme through the four formation "windows": human, spiritual, intellectual and pastoral. Delegates will be invited to register for three. Workshop leaders will be Ms Janine Wilson, Bishop Greg Homeming OCD, Archbishop Anthony Fisher OP and Fr David Ranson respectively. Special sessions will be available for retired clergy. The final Program will be advertised as soon as workshop titles and social outings are clarified.

Delegates will be able to book into the Novotel from 1pm on Monday, 8 April. The Conference will end with lunch on Thursday, 11 April. \$600 of the Conference cost is to be paid by the parish or organisation in which clergy minister. The major portion will be borne by the Archdiocese. Clergy on lesser duties or retired will be fully subsidized. Please click on the link below to register:

IMPORTANT MATTERS

Important Notice regarding Government Grants

Parishes should note the potential impact that may arise if an individual parish applies for, and receives grants, in its name, exceeding \$100,000 from Australian government agencies in a given financial year.

The majority of our parishes are classified a Basic Religious Charity (BRC) under the Australian Charities and Not-For-Profits Commission Act 2012, which allows for specific exemptions, specifically around disclosure and reporting. Any parish, however, receiving government grants exceeding \$100,000 in a single financial year may risk losing its BRC classification for that financial year and the subsequent two financial years. Restoration of BRC classification in the year that follows is dependent on meeting the BRC qualifying criteria in that financial year and will include not having received Government grants in excess of \$100,000 in any one of the preceding financial years.

The loss of BRC may necessitate the impacted parish providing a financial report to the Australian Charities Not-for-profits Commission for the current year, inclusive of financial statements for the parish, a signed and dated declaration from the Parish Priest/Administrator and a signed and dated auditor's report. This is likely to lead to additional parish staff resources and the engagement of external professional services, all at a significant cost impost to the parish.

Parishes are encouraged to contact Parish Support should they consider their BRC classification to be at risk.Parishes are also reminded that all grant applications, whether from Government or Community sources, that are applied for in the name of the Trustees should be initially directed to Parish Support. The Trustees also hold BRC classification and are bound by the same regulations mentioned above.

Alarmingly Australia has the highest proportion of poker machines per head of the population in the world. Current figures reveal Australia is home to 20 per cent of the world's poker machines, a staggering figure of approximately 200,000 machines with 48 per cent of them found in NSW. Addiction to these machines and other forms of gambling has a devastating impact on individuals and families, further compounding the effects of the current cost-of-living crisis.

CatholicCare Sydney provides a free and confidential **Financial Counselling service** for those affected by gambling, helping them take back control of their finances to ensure better outcomes for their future. Making the call to 13 18 19 is the first step to securing support from accredited and experienced financial counsellors and developing a financial position or budget to help manage financial issues. The service also includes guidance on which debts are priorities, assistance with grants and concessions, and access to legal help. The Financial Counselling service is impartial and independent and can be accessed via telephone, online or in person. The service is available to those with gambling addiction as well as family members impacted by the financial issues brought on by gambling.

The recent Mission Australia Youth Survey highlighted the increase in mental health concerns amongst today's teenagers, with 43% of those surveyed in NSW concerned about coping with stress and anxiety. **CatholicCare Sydney school counsellors** are available across 200 Catholic schools, working with students, their families, and teachers to address mental health concerns and help provide the best possible outcome for the student. School Counsellors provide free counselling in primary and secondary Catholic schools in the Sydney Archdiocese, helping students learn to cope with stress and emotional or behavioural difficulties, and encouraging resilience. Parents and teachers with any concerns, or who notice changes in a child including moodiness, sadness, withdrawal, sleep deprivation or loss of appetite should speak to a CatholicCare Sydney school counsellor and begin open and safe communication to help keep the student on the right path.

Do you have a friend or loved one going through a separation?

Family Dispute Resolution is a mediation process that can help families after separation. CatholicCare Sydney's practitioners provide a safe environment for discussion and decision-making for parents to work out the best arrangements for their children. Decisions about property and financial matters can also be made through this process.
