Cash In Transit – Are You Protected?

Did you know that under the new insurance arrangement, there is NO cover for 'money' during transit or away from the premises?

Using a licensed security company for banking collections, whilst it will incur an additional minimal cost to Parishes, it is a proactive measure in safeguarding yourself, staff, and volunteers from theft, loss, and potential harm.



There is a limit of cover for 'money' on the premises up to \$30,000, so the frequency of banking collections can be adjusted to each Parish's needs and budget, and whether weekly, fortnightly, or monthly pickups would be required.

Would you like to reduce your electricity costs?

As you know, the cost of electricity is continually increasing, and it is being reported in the media that it will increase even more in the future.

To this end, the Chancery Office is planning to undertake an electricity tender process for the parishes of the Archdiocese in an attempt to use our consolidated buying power to achieve better electricity prices for our parishes. Our ability to tender and achieve potential cost savings will be based on as many parishes supporting the initiative.

CDF Alert - Quest Donation Point Devices (Tap 'n Go) - 3G Shutdown

In coming weeks, the CDF will be providing advice and recommendations to each Parish via email with regards to the Quest Donation Point devices which rely upon the 3G mobile network that is set to be switched off from the end of August 2024. Quest Payment Systems have advised that this will render the old terminals useless. Whilst disappointing, given the initial outlay by Parishes, this opportunity does afford the Parish to avail of the new Commbank Smart Terminal and stand, at no cost to Parishes. It also allows for the saving of \$15 per month, per device in Quest fees by the Parish.

The CDF have advanced communications with the Commbank around the most efficient way of replacing the old Quest devices with new Commbank Smart Terminals. Of course, these will come at no cost to Sydney Archdiocesan Parishes.

Depending on whether your Parish currently uses Quest Donation Point exclusively, or whether your Parish already has one or more of the Commbank Smart Terminals working in tandem with Quest device/s, the CDF will tailor its recommendation to your Parish.

The transition will be a staged rollout so please be patient and keep an eye out for the email communication regarding this important fundraising option for your Parishioners.

Liturgy Office

Dear Bishops, Priests and Deacons,

Recently the Chancery has received a number of enquiries about faculties needed for celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation by priests.

Please be reminded about the following principles, based on canons 882-887 of the Code of Canon Law: The ordinary minister of Confirmation is a bishop. However, in some cases Confirmation can be celebrated by a priest who received a faculty to celebrate this sacrament (can. 882).

When the priest celebrates all three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) for a **non-baptised person** who is not an infant, the priest does not need to ask for a faculty to celebrate Confirmation because such faculty is given to him by the virtue of his office and by the law itself (can. 883, 2).

When the priest admits an **already baptised Christian** (e.g. a Protestant) into full communion with the Catholic Church, the priest also does not need to ask for a faculty to celebrate Confirmation, because such faculty is given to him by the virtue of his office and by the law itself (can. 883, 2).

However, when the priest wishes to confirm a person who is already **a baptised Catholic**, the priest indeed **does** need to ask for a faculty to celebrate such Confirmation.

In order to ask for this faculty, the priest should contact the Vicar General or one of the Auxiliary Bishops.

Also, please remember that the RCIA program is directed at those who are yet to be baptised. Therefore, baptised Catholics who are not yet confirmed should generally be prepared for this sacrament not through the RCIA program but through a separate preparation.

This note was prepared in consultation with Simon Yeak, Sacramental Life & RCIA Coordinator, and Fr Julian Wellspring, Judicial Vicar from the Tribunal of the Catholic Church Sydney Office. We hope that it will help you in planning your celebrations of the Sacraments of Initiation at the upcoming Easter Vigil and beyond.

FROM SYDNEY CATHOLIC EARLY CHILDHOOD SERVICES (SCECS)

I'd like to express my appreciation for the support given to Sydney Catholic Early Childhood Services (SCECS) over the last number of years. We now have established Early Childhood Services in the parishes of Rosebery, Sadleir-Miller, Auburn, Coogee and Caringbah. We have Development Applications in Council, or are very close, in the parishes of Austral, Holsworthy, Lurnea, Annandale, Revesby Heights, Flemington and MarsfieldMany priests will know that we are working closely with their parishes to establish an Early Childhood Service.

We are working to build excellent services:

- We want them to truly support parents in sharing our faith with their children and to work closely with parish priests and parish schools in doing this. We have employed a full-time Faith Formation Officer, Bernadette Bridle, to work with our staff and priests to make our Centres true places of evangelisation.
- With an eye to the marginalised or those in need of support, we have opened Centres in parishes that "for profit" childcare operations would not go to.
- We work with local parish Catholic Primary schools to provide a pipeline of children ready and eager for "enrolment".
- We work closely with parishes to design Centres which work well with parish and school and provide a marketcompetitive income stream to the parish in rent payments.

We also operate 46 before and after school care programs, again with a view of supporting the local parishes and Catholic Primary schools. In respect of these programs, we also pay commercially competitive rates and like our Early Childhood Services, we support schools and parishes where purely "for profit" businesses will not go.

We will have some of our staff at the upcoming clergy conference at Wollongong. So please look for us and learn more about what we do.

Finally, please support us. We are part of the Church here in Sydney. We have the same mission as the parishes and schools. We offer so much more than purely "for profit" operations, which can and do seek to take our operations away from parishes on purely financial grounds. We are commercially competitive. But we offer so much more, and I hope that priests will consider the totality of our SCECS and Church mission before choosing to offer parish facilities to "for Profit" operators.

The most common form of elder abuse in Australia is psychological followed by financial and neglect.

SAFEGUARDING

OVERDUE: Child-Related Activity Registers

Standard 9 of the Child Safe Standards, National Catholic Standards and National Principles refers to Continuous Improvement. This Standard's focus is ensuring that there is monitoring and continual improvement of child safeguarding practices and that these practices are reviewed, tracked and reported. The returns and audits of Child-Related Activity Registers helps the Archdiocese and Parishes to meet this Standard.


